

Club Notes

Our August Show and Sale was on the second weekend in August, the Duck Race weekend - - and we survived it again! The tents were set up on Thursday evening, August 12th, with the exhibition and show on the 13th, 14th, and the 15th. This was the third time we have done this show and it was the most successful to date. We had several club members who were in double digits as to the number of prints sold. Last year flower images were the best selling items, but at this year's event, wildlife and scenic images seemed to be the ones that sold. Also, prints that were not matted (or framed) were the ones that sold best.

We have been promised even more room for next year's show, so we would encourage all members to start getting their inventory in order. We need a lot of your input to make this ongoing event the best we can.

The Juried Show

Last newsletter I warned you about how fast this show was approaching - - and I was right, wasn't I? There is another entry form on page three of this newsletter for our October Juried Show at the Eastern Idaho Technical College. Hopefully, none of you were procrastinators and I am talking to the wrong audience; but it takes time to get the prints enlarged; it takes time to get the prints matted and framed. That time will seem to evaporate for you the closer it gets to October!

Please note the following deadlines that are listed on the entry form. We need the entries returned to us by September 25th so that we can get this information into the computer for the night of judging. The prints are to be delivered to EITC on September 29. There is no area for storage at EITC. If you cannot deliver the prints on that day, please contact other club members so that they can take your prints into the building on the 29th.

September 30 will be our night of judging and we do plan to have the dinner for the judges before judging as in the past, but the location for this meal has not yet been determined. We ask that all of you attend the judging since this is a very good learning tool. (At the end of the judging, please help transfer the prints from the judging hall to the administration building where they will hang.) We will hang the show on October 1st and remove the prints on October 29th. Again, because of the lack of storage, the prints must be picked up by 5 p.m. on that date. Other club members will help you if you can not pick your prints up by that deadline.

Entry fees remain at \$6 per print with a maximum number of submissions at 5 per person. There is enough room to hang about 150 – 175 images and we would like to have all of those walls covered. This is our 15th show and we would like for this to continue our tradition of getting better with each presentation. But we will need many people to help. So please volunteer when asked!

Advancement **Program**

The theme for September's Advancement Program is: Waterfalls (watch out, Sam). Bring your 3 best prints/slides and join us at 7:30 p.m. on September 16 in the conference room at 1900 Grandview Ave. You will be amazed at how much you can learn by sharing images with each other.
