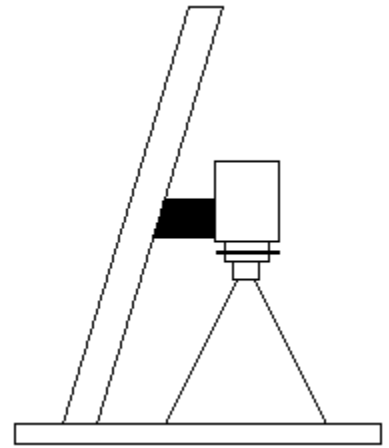

Newsletter Costs

Costs for your newsletter keep climbing. Just the \$.02 per newsletter increase with the last postage increase adds \$14.40 in mailing costs by the end of a year. When I first started doing the newsletter 19 years ago, twenty bucks per month covered two half tone images (\$6) and \$14 for printing and mailing. Now with no half tone images, we have \$28 for printing and \$24 for postage. This is over two members' dues per month just for this tome.

We have always mailed the newsletter to the photography teachers at the local high schools as well as the other clubs in the state. We also place about ½ dozen newsletters in each of the various galleries in town to reach out to the local photographic community as part of our educational efforts. I think these should continue to show that artistic, well produced photography exists in our community.

Would going to electronic newsletters to some of our members be enough to keep the costs down? Would they be read? Would you know to look on the Internet on the right day to benefit from the e-mail? These are some questions that we need to discuss at future meetings.

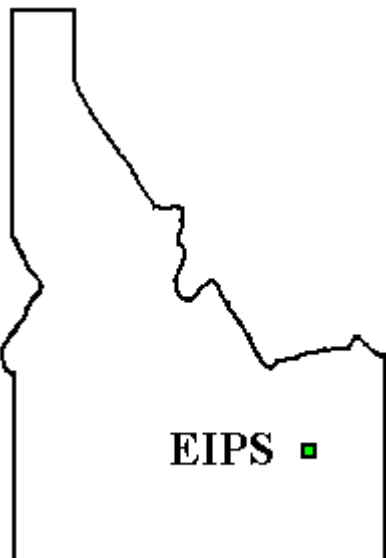
